# WORLD ARCHERY STARS



World Archery Stars are available for archers using recurve or compound bows in World Archery registered Star events (1440-rounds) and they must be:

#### Men shooting 1440 Round: 90m, 70m, 50m, 30m Women shooting 1440 Round: 70m, 60m, 50m, 30m

World Archery Stars are for scores of 1000 (white), 1100 (black), 1200 (blue), 1300 (red), 1350 (gold) and 1400 (purple). The Gold World Archery Star on a coloured circular background is the Compound Star, whereas for recurve the 1000 pin is just the gold Star itself, and the higher ones are on a shield of the relevant colour. An archer may claim only one of each Star, but as the recurve and compound stars are considered different awards archers may claim both the recurve and compound World Archery Stars if they shoot both bow types.

Claims for 1350 and 1400 World Archery Stars are individually processed by World Archery from claims made to World Archery by Archery Canada on behalf of the archer.

# SILVER WORLD ARCHERY STARS



Silver World Archery Stars follow the same rules but are only for archers competing in the Cadet or Master categories (Master effectiv for rounds shot on or after 1 April 2010) with:

#### Cadet Boys and Master Men shooting a 1440 Round: 70m, 60m, 50m, 30m Cadet Girls and Master Women shooting a 1440 Round: 60m, 50m, 40m, 30m

The Silver World Archery Stars are identical to the World Archery Stars except that any gold colouring on the pins is replaced with silver.

### **BASIC GUIDELINES FOR ALL PINS:**

- In order to qualify for pins, the event must be registered with World Archery, not just Archery Canada. You can determine the registration level by:
  - o Asking the host of the tournament what the registration level is
  - o Checking the calendar on the World Archery website
  - Checking the calendar on the Archery Canada website (lower right hand corner of the main page, click on the date of the event, and all events for that day will be listed along with the registration level for each event)
- One score per pin applied for. This means that if you shoot a 1213 v, you can apply for a 1200 pin (or whatever lower value pin you have not yet received). You will not get a 1200, 1100, AND 1000 pin—ie, you will not receive 3 pins for the one score.
- You are only allowed to receive one of each type of pin. ie. You can only ever be awarded one 1200 pin, but you could receive a 1200 World Archery Star and a 1200 Silver World Archery Star in your lifetime.

Silver World Archery Target Awards are available only for archers competing in the Cadet or Master categories using recurve bows in World Archery registered events, and shooting the following scores for the appropriate round:


The Silver World Archery Target Awards are the same as the World Archery Target Awards except that any gold background colour on the

World Archery Target Awards is replaced by silver.

Claims for Gold and Purple Target Awards are individually processed by World Archery from claims made to World Archery by Archery Canada on behalf of the archer.

\*\*It is important to note that archers are allowed only one of each colour pin, no matter which type of round is shot in order to achieve the appropriate score.\*\*

## WORLD ARCHERY ARROWHEADS



Listed below are the scores required for the various World Archery Arrowheads shot over the minimum 24 Target Marked or Unmarked rounds (scored out of 432) in registered World Archery Arrowhead field events.

### \* ARROWHEADS FOR CADET ARCHERS:

Using these tables, Cadet archers shooting their specific round in the Green Arrowhead score range may claim a Green Arrowhead. A score of Brown Arrowhead level or higher means that the archer is eligible to claim a Brown Arrowhead. This also applies to our Intermediate sighted archers shooting from Blue pegs and Intermediate and Cub barebow recurvers shooting from Yellow pegs. No Arrowheads higher than Brown may be claimed unless the athlete is shooting the Open rounds.

Claims for Silver and Gold Arrowheads are individually processed by World Archery from claims made to World Archery by Archery Canada on behalf of the archer.
